Host Site Organization Description

For nearly 25 years, our mission has been to unleash the power of citizens to heal themselves and build community. Project Description

Black Community Commission on Health (BCC) comprises committed Ramsey County residents, African American cultural elders, and representatives from key Black community organizational partners such as Rondo ReConnect, Everybody's In, and St. Paul Promise Neighborhood. BCC is responsible for listening to the community about their overall health concerns, keeping the pulse of the community, and identifying and sharing the community expressed priorities. In turn we partner with Ramsey County directors and leaders to support and advocate for co-investments between the community and Ramsey County.

- Prepare people in the culture and share knowledge with them about your area of expertise

- Build resources and train staff and community Navigators on basic computer use tutoring, data collection, and knowledge production
- Desktop publishing/document/presentation development.
- Data Systems design and maintenance.
- Provide education on basic data collection theory and practice, and specific CWC database user training to staff/faculty/contractors.
- Engage community participants through phone, email, and community events
- Ensure seamless flow of communication between community and staff
- Organizing and coordinating community-based and internal meetings and events
- Build and maintain thorough and accurate records and communication systems, including data and activities reporting and essential paper and digital files
- Ensure timely internal and external communications through written emails, phone calls, video calls, and fax
- Build and maintain internal inventory systems
